Bill Overview

- Sponsors: Sen. Janet Buckner and Rep. Meghan Lukens
- Slated for introduction soon
- Establishes one-time bonuses for eligible providers who offer universal preschool (UPK)
- Joint Budget Committee has approved a one-time \$2.5 million placeholder the bill will establish the structure of the bonuses
- The goal is increase UPK provider participation to ensure that all children have access to a universal preschool classroom in their communities and to strengthen the mixed delivery system



Bonus Structure

- All UPK providers who have registered by August 31, 2023 and have not previously participated in a state-run preschool program (e.g. Colorado Preschool Program) will receive a base bonus, (estimated at \$700-\$1,000)
- Additionally, all UPK provider who maintain or expand their licensed capacity to serve infants and toddlers from April 1, 2022 to April 1, 2024 will receive an additional bonus at the end of the fiscal year
- CDEC will distribute a final tier of targeted bonuses to providers in low-capacity preschool areas (where UPK capacity is insufficient to meet family demand)



Use of Funds

- Providers can use bonus payments for a variety of purposes, including:
 - Resources and materials to expand quality in the program
 - Coaching, professional development, or training
 - Bonuses for staff
 - Other services to support quality practices

HB21-1304


- Signed June 23, 2021
- Called for the creation of two reports:
 - Department of Early Childhood Transition Plan
 - ECLC unanimously approved in November 2021
 - <u>Colorado Universal Preschool Recommendations</u>
 - ECLC unanimously approved in January 2022

HB22-1295

- Signed April 25, 2022
- Aligned with the recommendations of the two reports
- Established responsibilities of CDEC and the Executive Director
- Moved early childhood programs to the new department
- Created the Colorado Universal Preschool Program

CDEC officially launched July 1, 2022!

UPK Family Application Data

- Total number of four-year-olds matched = 26,335
- Families of four-year-olds matched to their 1st choice = 86.1%
- Families matched to any one of their choices = 94.3%
- Families without a match = 5.7%
- Total number of three-year-olds matched = 4,328



Quality Standards

The Department shall develop, and the Executive Director shall establish by rule, the quality standards that each preschool provider must meet to receive funding through the Colorado Universal Preschool Program.

The quality standards must, at a minimum, reflect national and community-informed best practices with regard to school readiness, academic and cognitive development, healthy environments, social-emotional learning, and child and family outcomes.





Teacher Development and Instructional Practices



Professional development for teachers:

• Focused on improving teacher-child interactions and quality of instruction, including improving fidelity in implementing evidence-based curricula and student outcomes

Instructional practice:

- Promote learning through developmentally appropriate practices that include a mix of structured activities and play
- Increase and support learning using instructional practices that build on previous learning
- Include a focus on age-appropriate classroom environments and ongoing informal assessments of learning
- Employ teaching strategies that have been shown to meet the needs of children who are dual-language learner



Healthy Development

- Limit use of out-of-school suspension and expulsion
- Reflect best practices in early childhood mental health, including promoting access to early childhood mental health consultation
- Assist in connecting families to resources that offer voluntary vision, hearing, dental, and health screenings in their home language, and, upon parent request, referrals to appropriate health providers for enrolled children
- Assist in connecting families to resources that offer voluntary health and developmental screenings, which must include the use of valid and reliable screening tools that are developmentally, culturally, and linguistically appropriate





Family and Community Engagement



- Engage with parents and neighborhood leaders in a formal and meaningful way, including seeking input for policy and programming decisions
- Communicate with children's parents/families in their home language



UPK Quality Standards Planning

The planned phases of work include:

- Phase I Research, review and stakeholdering for UPK Quality Standards Rule
- Phase II Develop Cross-Department Standards, including workforce, professional learning credentials and pathways
- Phase III Resource library, pathways, reporting plan

CDEC will announce details of each phase by March 31, 2023.
