ECLC Co-Chair Susan Steele opened the meeting and introduced Melanie Collier, a HIPPY Instructor with Spring Institute, which is the only program in Denver that serves non-English, non-Spanish speaking families. Melanie shared about the success of HIPPY in the Denver community and the way HIPPY prepares children for kindergarten, and supports the needs of families in supporting their child's healthy development.
