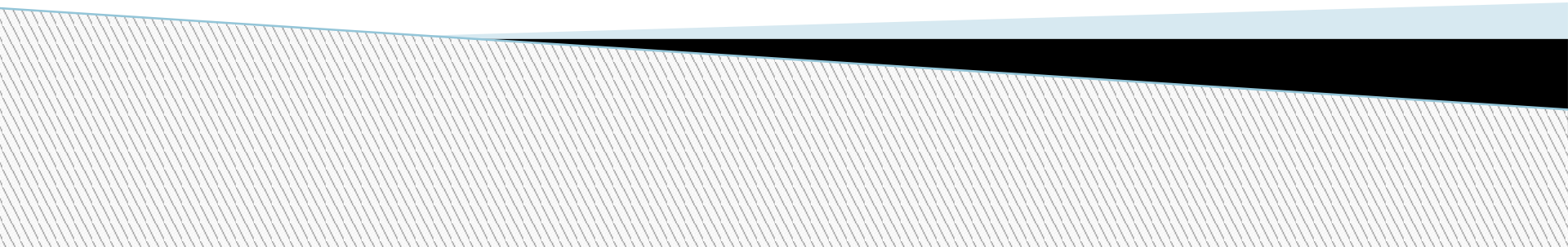


Meeting Objectives


- Share subsequent improvements based on evaluation results of the PARTNER survey

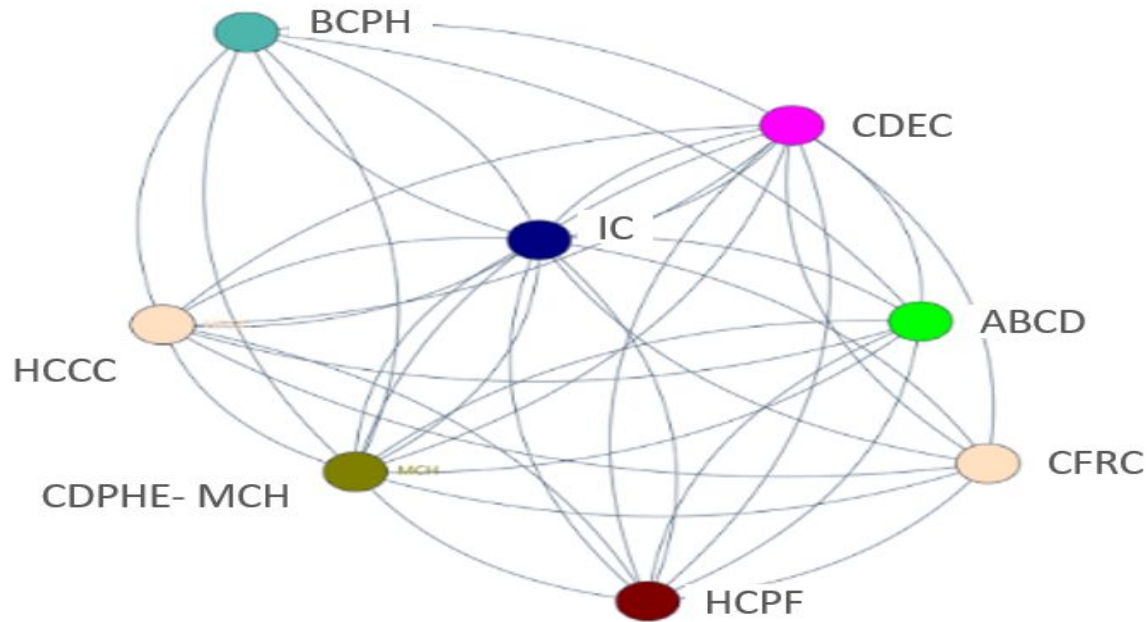

Context

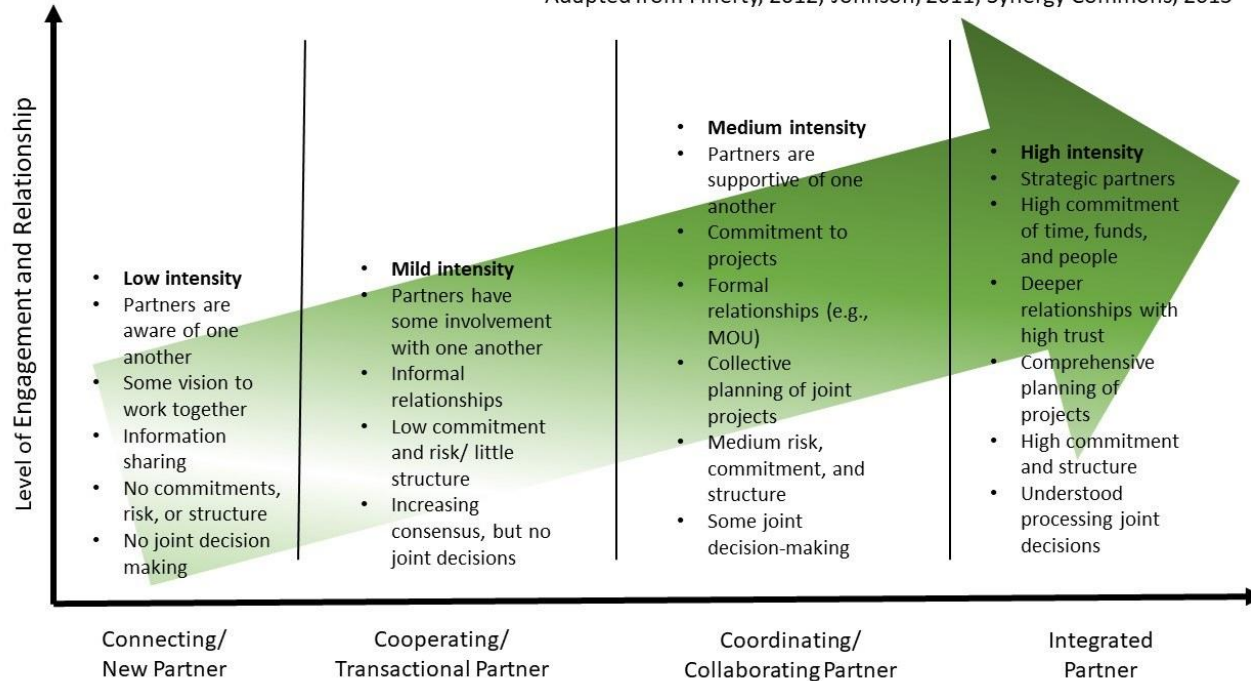
- 8 core ECCS agencies representing key sectors (as listed in ECCS grant) chosen
 - Agencies filled out the survey as teams (if more than one participant in ECCS)
 - This is a baseline; PARTNER will be given twice more before 2026 to assess change over time
 - PARTNER measures ***network/systems*** connections and strengths

Levels of Partnership Continuum

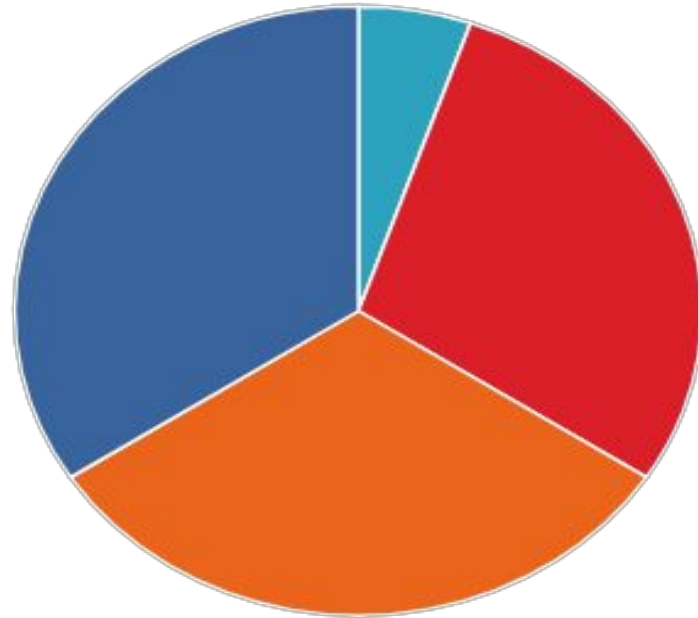

ECCS Levels of Partnership Continuum



■ Awareness ■ Cooperation ■ Coordination ■ Integration

Assessing Communication (4 point scale)

Communication is the average of scores on:

- 1) How **reliable** is each partner?
- 2) To what extent does each partner **share a mission** with the collaboration's mission and goals?
- 3) How **open to discussion** is each partner?

Attribute	Mean Score	Std. Deviation
Reliability	3.71	.31
Mission	3.69	.31
Openness	3.75	.27

Assessing Collaboration (4 point scale)

Collaboration is the average of scores on:

- 1) To what extent does each partner have **power and influence** to impact the overall mission of this collaborative?
- 2) What is each partner's **level of involvement** in the collaboration?
- 3) To what extent does each partner **contribute resources** to the collaboration?

Attribute	Mean Score	Std. Deviation
Power	3.19	.47
Involvement	3.17	.62
Resources	2.96	.47

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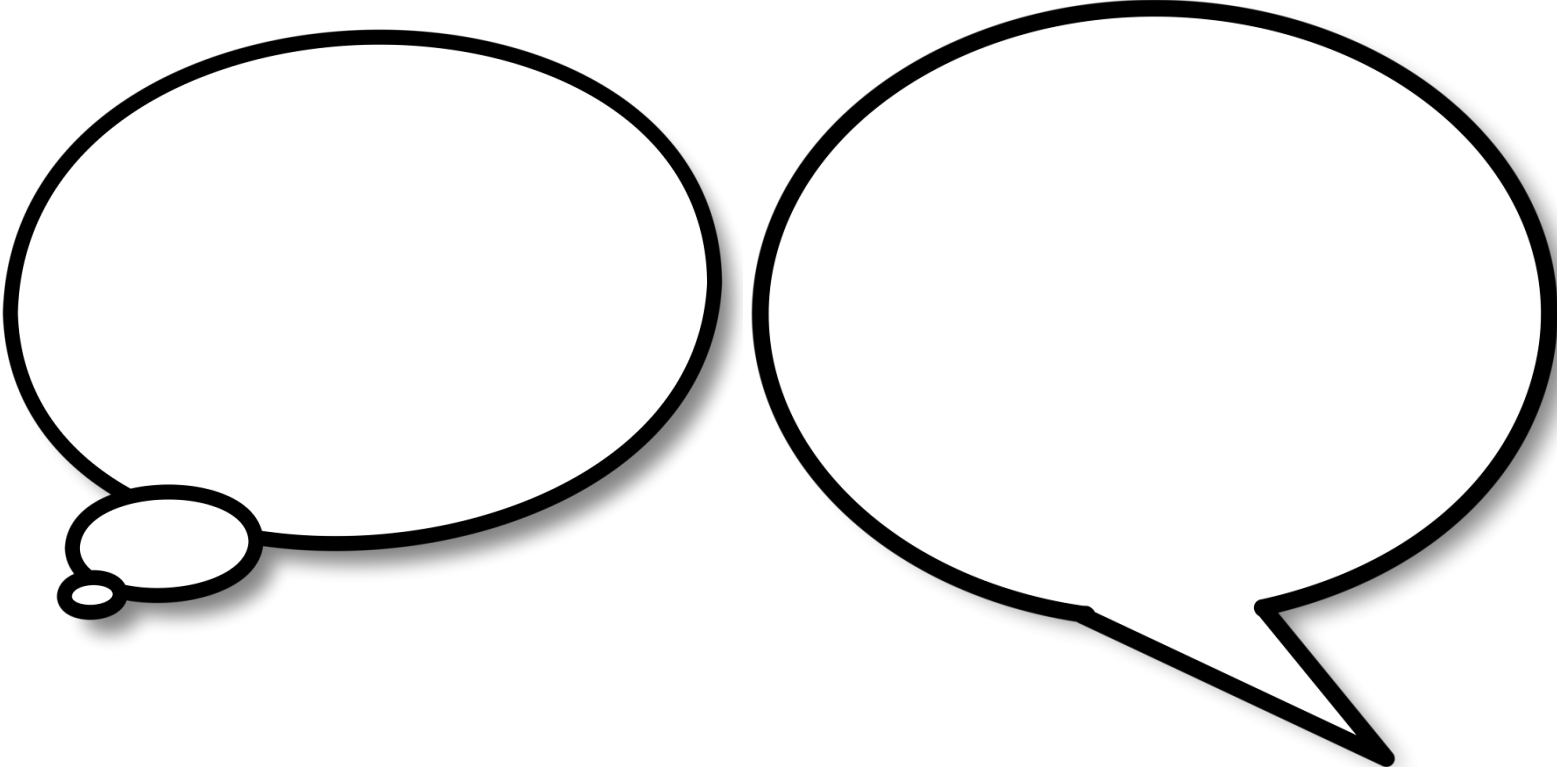
